Memphis International Airport Receives \$14.8 million in FAA Airport Terminal Program Funding

Additional \$1 million grant awarded for new Baker airport terminal

The U.S. Department of Transportation's Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) has awarded \$14.8 million in Airport Terminal Program (ATP) funding to Memphis International Airport (MEM).

Today, <u>the FAA announced \$967 million in funding to 99 U.S. airports</u>. This funding is from one of three aviation programs created through the

to airports to expand terminal capacity, promote competition, increase energy efficiency, and improve accessibility for passengers across the country.

This award funds a portion of MEM's <u>Terminal Modernization program</u>, which involves increasing the size of the terminal and renovating the ticketing and baggage areas, expanding the security checkpoint, implementing technological improvements to baggage and security, and seismic enhancements.

The Memphis-Shelby County Airport Authority (MSCAA) also received a separate \$1 million award that will help fund the construction of a new terminal at Charles W. Baker Airport in Millington.

"This funding will help us continue to reinvent Memphis International Airport by starting the modernization of the ticketing and baggage areas," said Scott Brockman, MSCAA President and CEO. "It will also benefit our general aviation operations by helping to fund the construction of a new terminal at Charles W. Baker Airport. We are grateful to the FAA for this award, and we thank all of our members of Congress for their ongoing support of MEM, its passengers and its employees."

MEM is partnering with WhereWeFly, a software company that provides interactive mapping and destination marketing to airports as well as FlightPath3D applications that are used by more than 70 major airlines.



The new feature is mobile friendly and allows passengers to filter the map by flight duration, airline, and specific interests such as beaches. The map shows passengers which airlines serve certain destinations and provides scheduling information, as well as links to airline websites to enable booking. Passengers can also view a series of informational videos about each destination served by MEM. Travel details can be shared by email, text or social media.

MEM offers Spring Break Travel Tips

With area schools observing their Spring Break in the coming weeks and travel numbers increasing, passenger traffic at Memphis International Airport (MEM) could exceed pre-pandemic levels from 2019. The peak travel period is expected to fall between March 9-13.

With passenger volumes expected to be high and airlines booked to capacity, MEM is recommending that passengers arrive at the airport at least two hours before their scheduled departure time. This is especially important for travelers with early morning flights between 4-7 a.m.

Passenger Travel Tips

- MEM recommends that travelers arrive at the airport at least TWO HOURS before their schedule departure time.
- Prior to coming to the airport, passengers can also save time by checking in online via their airline's website.
- Passengers should check directly with their airlines to monitor schedules.
- Airlines rather than the airport are responsible for all aspects of ticketing, scheduling, gate operations and baggage handling. Check with your airline if you have questions about these subjects.
- MEM parking lots may periodically reach capacity during peak travel days. When this occurs, additional signage will be added, and additional parking

economy, short-term and long-term garages reach capacity.

- For convenience, drivers parking in the overflow lot may want to drop off luggage and other passengers at the terminal before parking.
- Should the overflow parking lot open, MEM will operate a shuttle between the overflow parking lot and the terminal.

TSA

- With the improved security capabilities of TSA's new Computed Tomography (CT) equipment at the MEM checkpoints, passengers can now leave their laptop computers, electronic devices and 3-1-1 compliant liquids in their carry-on bags for screening.
- However, there are size limitations for these CT units and all items must fit into the grey divesting bins. Nothing can be placed directly on the moving belts. All oversized bags must be checked at the airline ticket counters because they will not be accepted for screening at any TSA checkpoint.
- Bin size dimensions are as follows:
 - Depth: 5.5 inches
 - Width: 19.5 inches
 - Length: 24.5 inches
 - CT Tunnel Height: 16.5 inches
- Travelers are encouraged to examine carry-on luggage to ensure no prohibited items are contained within, and review the Transportation Security Administration's (TSA's) <u>list of prohibited items</u>.
- Firearms in carry-on bags are prohibited by federal law. Firearms can be transported in checked baggage if they are properly declared to the airline and packed <u>in accordance with TSA guidelines.</u>

Last week, representatives from the Memphis International Airport (MEM) were part of a delegation led by the Greater Memphis Chamber that traveled to Nashville for their annual MEM2NASH trip. The purpose of MEM2NASH is to bring the business priorities of the Memphis region to the Governor, state legislators, and administration officials. The delegation included the Greater Memphis Chamber, City of Memphis, Memphis Tourism, MEM, along with additional business and community leaders. More than 50 business and community leaders attended 22 meetings with state legislators and additional meetings with Gov. Bill Lee and his staff.
